Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.

I do not give to you as the world gives.

Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."

~ John 14:27

That's the watchword which was drawn on behalf of the congregation on New Year's Eve. The watchword is a lovely tradition in the Moravian Church, dating back to the days of our renewal at Herrnhut in current-day Germany. The Daily Texts were instituted by Count Zinzendorf as a prayer practice to reconcile and unite a troubled community. Out of this came the tradition of picking a guiding text for the new year. It's also a bit of a tradition for the pastor to give a bit of commentary on the congregation's watchword and ponder what it might mean for the coming year.

Our 2025 congregational watchword comes from John's account of Jesus' farewell discourse, which happened after the humble yet triumphal entry into Jerusalem, when Jesus gave his ultimate teaching about who he was, what that meant, and what was to come. What strikes me about having a passage of the farewell discourse to guide a congregation is Jesus' emphasis on what comes after he is no longer immediately present. He gives his truth, provides assurance, and says with a prayer: you know it's going to be up to you now, right?

Specifically from our passage, verse 27, I'm pondering the significance of Jesus statement: I do not give to you as the world gives. For me, and I hope for our congregation, my sense is of an empowerment to follow Jesus no matter what is happening in the world, and to let our motivation be for what Jesus is calling us to. Of course we won't be perfect, God knows we can't achieve idealized perfection. Just like the early disciples listening to Jesus give this teaching, there will be moments when we say wait, what? And our earthly concerns and emotions will take charge, but we can dwell in the first part of the verse: peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. In that, the troubles of our hearts can be eased, and we can take on those things we're afraid of.

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." ~John 13:34

As February approaches, TV commercials, storefronts, and interior displays remind us that Valentine's Day is just around the corner. Romantic love deserves to be acknowledged and celebrated, but we can never let that overshadow or contradict the love we cling to in its purest form—God's love; His love for us and our love for God. In his book of scriptural meditations, Sources of Strength, Jimmy Carter writes "God is love: agape love, forgiving love, love for those who are unattractive, those who don't deserve to be loved, those who don't love us back." God's love challenges us to show His love in thought, word, and deed. (Colossians 3:17) This is what Jesus came to earth to teach us.

To love one another is a tall order because it is limitless, and this can be challenging for many of us. Recently a devotion in *The Upper Room* relating to "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:44), gave me pause to reflect. A wife was complaining to her spouse about a woman who was causing trouble "wherever she goes". The husband listened and sympathized, but then pointed out to her that God loves the "troublemaker" just as much as God loves his wife. That statement left an indelible impression on me. The depth and equality of God's love for all humankind, tells me that I can do better. Can we all do better?

Hope to see you then, and stay warm!


