Everything In Between: Meeting God in the Midst of Extremes!

I've been reflecting on the nature of extremes, how everything is just the most, everything is about argument and adversarial tension, engineered to grab attention and lead to outrage. Even this paragraph falls into it, using the term everything, when reality shows that the world is full of nuance, and stating things to capture attention do just that and not much more. Lent is a time to set aside the distractions and seek peace in truth, just as Jesus did in his time apart in the wilderness.

This year for our Wednesday evening services, we're letting the Gospel of Luke guide us through Lent using a series produced by Sanctified Art. Beginning with Jesus setting his face toward Jerusalem (Luke 9:51), our worship series flows through several familiar stories—the Good Samaritan, Mary and Martha, the fruitless fig tree, the Lost Sheep, Zacchaeus, and more. Many of these stories are well-known in both sacred and secular imagination and hold significance in pop culture, church history, politics, and everything in between.

When we study these scriptures, you may be struck by how Jesus' ministry disrupted the established social, political, and religious divides of his time. Jesus intentionally pointed out cultural and political extremes to emphasize the radical, inclusive, and surprising love of God. When we study these stories in their historical and cultural context, we see how they mirror the divisions many of us experience in our families, churches, and communities today.

Our theme, "Everything In Between," invites us to navigate the polarities in our lives with more faith, intention, and openness to be transformed. You will see that each weekly sub-theme explores two supposed binaries, like "faith & works" or "rest & growth," or "grief & hope." We often consider these ideas to be opposing. However, as we explore these concepts within the scriptures, we find nuance and complexity. We find that these dichotomies are false. We might begin to see a full spectrum instead of black and white. We might find that God is present in between.

And so, throughout the Lent season, we invite you to look beyond black and white binaries and easy answers. We encourage you to notice the dichotomies that define our lives, but also imagine where God might be meeting us beyond the categories we create. This Lent, we're trusting that God shows up in shades of gray, rainbow hues, and everywhere in between.

In looking at opportunities for our Lent Wednesday offerings, I've been studying things that are helpful in the midst of extreme situations. One thing that is shown to be beneficial, whether the extremes are political, economic, or even weather-related, is food security, especially when it is combined with community. This year our offering will again go to support Loaves & Fishes and the effort to provide local feeding and community ministry.

ELDER PERSPECTIVE

On Sunday February 9, Pastor Ian's message focused on discipleship and following Jesus. A part of his message had us think about the question posed to many of us when we were younger, "What do you want to be when you grow up." The closing hymn for this service, "I the Lord of Sea and Sky", is one of my favorite hymns and makes me truly think about how I have listened (at times) to God's leading.

We need to remember that He wants us to be open to His direction(s) for our lives as His leading may not always be a smack in the head, but rather needing to listen to subtle suggestions. Listening to God's direction is plainly stated in Isaiah 55:8-9, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher that your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

Below is a poem (author unknown) I kept at my desk when I was working to remind me that we need to be open to God's leading, no matter how loud or quiet that may be. I don't remember where or when I saw this poem but it puts into perspective how we should approach each and every day, listening for God and His direction for our lives.

Whispers

The man whispered, "God, speak to me" and a meadowlark sang. But the man did not hear. So, the man yelled, "God, speak to me" and the thunder rolled across the sky. But the man did not listen.



In the spirit of collective commitment and thoughtful generosity, Moravians across America are gearing up for the fifth annual **Moravian Day of Giving on Tuesday, March 4th**, a day that transcends individual contributions to make a combined impact.

The Moravian Day of Giving is an opportunity for Moravians to make unexpected gifts above and beyond their regular tithe or pledge. On this day, individuals are encouraged to utilize the Moravian Ministries Foundation in America (MMFA)'s online Giving Portal to contribute to their church, Moravian agencies, or ministries that ignite passion and resonate with their values.

On previous Days of Giving, Schoeneck asked for contributions to the Organ Restoration fund or to the Schoeneck congregation. While we certainly will accept any gifts from this day, this year we encourage you to think about expanding your giving outside of our congregation. You can give to Camp Hope, Moravian Open Door, Essentials Café, or any other Moravian organization or ministry that you wish.

If you are undecided where to make a donation, MMFA suggests you consider a gift to a Field of Interest (FOI) Fund. These funds award grants to Moravian congregations and organizations for ministry projects in eight areas:

Hunger & Thirst Clothing

Housing & Shelter Healing & Health

Prison Ministry Environmental Stewardship

Racial Awareness, Equity, & Reconciliation Prevention of Violence Against Women

A gift to one of the FOI funds will help unlock matching contributions of \$2,500 for each of the 8 FOI funds.

Additionally, MMFA will grant \$2,500 to the 5 Moravian organizations (churches, agencies, camps, etc.) with the most unique individual donors. "Unique individual donors" refers to the number of distinct individuals who donate on the Moravian Day of Giving. Each donor is counted only once, regardless of the number of times they contribute or the amount of their contributions. However, if a donor contributes to both their home congregation and a Moravian agency on the Moravian Giving Portal, that person will be counted as one donor for BOTH organizations. Donors are able to donate to more than one organization with one transaction.

How to Participate:

- **Make a Donation:** Visit the <u>Moravian Giving Portal</u> to contribute to your congregation, ministry, or organization on Tuesday, March 4th.
- **Support Field of Interest Funds:** Contribute to the Field of Interest Funds, so that they can reach the matching contribution of \$2,500 for each fund!
- **Spread the Spirit on Social Media:** Use #IGiveMoravian to share your reasons for giving and inspire others to join the day of generosity.
