An author I follow recently said: we think of our story having a beginning, a middle, and an end, but really everything is just a series of middles.

Maybe I'm pondering this because of this moment in the church year. We're following Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem, we know that after the hosanna-filled triumphant entry will come the cross, and the resurrection. Is this the end of the gospel story, or is it just the beginning? As with most things, there are upsides and downsides to this pondering.

Here's a shock: in the middle of a series called Everything In Between, and at the transition point of ending and beginning in the life of Jesus we experience every year at this time, and even the equinox moment of putting behind and looking ahead, the answer lies in all of it. Endings bring Beginnings. Looking back with perspective we find that something we thought was just an ending turns out to be a beautiful middle, and the exciting fresh start turns out to go on and on and we realize hey, this is a positive new normal.

In all things I'm happy to be right in the middle of things with you.
