World Bicycle Relief...Buffalo Bike

I used to bike everywhere. As my vision went I had to give up driving, but as long as I wasn't a danger to self and others I pedaled all around my home city. Ok, I maybe kept riding past the point I should have. No, it wasn't another trip to the E.R. to get patched up after a crash that finally got through, a jogger caught and passed me from behind and I realized my safe speed was pretty much walking pace, might as well just walk.

My point here is, I know the freedom and productivity advantage a bike brings over walking when a car isn't an option. That's what made me sit up and go "hmmm..." when a video about World Bicycle Relief and their Buffalo Bike came across my Youtube feed.

Using a bike for increased productivity in rural African villages is nothing new of course, but WBR wondered if a different approach to the bike itself might help. After talking to many, many actual users about their bikes, they came up with the need to overcome some key challenges: flat tires, ability to modify with basic welding equipment, and eliminating the need for specialty tools to do basic repairs. They took these challenges to bike companies used to developing technologies to win races like the Tour de France, and ended up with the Buffalo Bike...heavy duty spokes and puncture resistant tires, a frame you could attach stuff to with a basic welder used by many rural handy people, and fasteners that all took regular wrenches and screwdrivers. Oh, and all for \$165 assembled and delivered.

That's another key to WBR's efforts, assembly is done locally, providing jobs and experience within the network they've set up, and a mechanic is trained to do service within a given area.

Bikes are given to medical professionals, drastically increasing the number of people they can visit in a day. Bikes are given to students, meaning they don't have to stop their education because of distance. The nearest secondary school is 10 miles away. That's a one hour ride instead of a 3 hour walk.

Inspiring, but why is this your newsletter piece this month (I hear you asking)? This year's Mission & Evangelism offering envelope will go to support World Bicycle Relief, which provide bicycles to the developing world. I love talking bikes. What's the goal? I'm thinking aspirationally that we could raise enough to provide 10 bikes, \$1650...I would love to find out I underestimated that amount.

One other thing, the Coalition for Appropriate transport (CAT) bike co-op in Bethlehem is building us a close approximation of a Buffalo Bike as a demonstrator. It wouldn't be right to use WBR's brand, so we need to name our bike. Let me know your thoughts, extra consideration if you can work "Yak" into the name.

ELDERS PERSPECTIVE

"For you always have the poor with you . . . " Matthew 26:11

A Sunday afternoon in mid March; will spring ever come I wondered as I stepped from a friend's car in front of the imposing church with its blood red doors. In front of us a car was parked at the curb. I barely noticed, but my friend did. "Look at the mess in that car," she uttered, a little too loudly. I glanced back. A man was hunched in the driver's seat, and my friend was right; the entire car's interior was filled. I saw mainly newspapers before I turned away in embarrassment.

Inside the church in the fellowship hall, we were seated, waiting for the "free" concert to begin. The performing artist was guitarist Craig Thatcher. What was the chance he would sing "Streets of London", a favorite of mine among his repertoire. I glanced around the room, and directly across from me in the front row was the man from the messy car. He was disheveled, unkept, a look of sadness on his face. I could not take my eyes off of him. The hall began to fill up; most seats were taken—except for three in the front row. The man sat alone. The room was filled; more chairs were brought in, but still, the man sat alone.

The concert ended with "Streets of London". Although I have heard this song many times, that night I was hearing the words for the first time—phrases like "Have you seen the old man in a closed-down market, kicking up the paper with his worn out shoes . . ." And the chorus, "So how can you tell me you're lonely and say for you that the sun don't shine? Let me take you by the hand and lead you through the streets of . . .!" The concert was over and the man was gone. No one seemed to know who he was. Had they even noticed him? I was sad, and I was angry. Are the poor and lonely invisible people? Why didn't anyone sit next to him? Worse than that, why didn't I!

Late April, in our church parking lot with cars lined up for the community dinner, I saw the solitary man from the concert, sitting in his "filled up" car. I greeted him and told him that I had seen him at the concert at the church (with the blood red doors). He smiled. I did not tell him that my heart broke that he was sitting alone, and that the next time I would sit with him.
