The Joyful Noise Newsletter September 2025

Grace, mercy and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all...

Those are the words with which we start the service of Holy Communion, leading into a right hand of fellowship signifying oneness in Christ and the desire to be at peace with one another.

I've been thinking a lot about communion this week, especially how it connects and unites us, and of course how it has been a divisive force in the history of Christianity. Our practices have deep meanings which reflect and express our connection with God through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

One of our beautiful traditions is the practice of an open table, even for the very young. Like many denominations, the Moravian Church restricted communion to members, specifically those who had completed confirmation. In the 1970s and 80s some of our pastors and theologians began pondering how this failed to reflect God's grace and the gift of the sacraments given through Jesus. In 1990, their practice of offering communion to young children was affirmed by a Provincial synod, and in 1995 the Synod of the World Wide Unity extended this practice across the Moravian denomination. This expresses the faith that even the youngest members of our church family can understand their inclusion in God's salvation and participate in this sacrament which connects us to Jesus.

And so all this brings us around to an offering of early communion classes at Schoeneck this fall. We're going to offer a workshop for children and their parents or responsible grownups. If adults would like a refresher we can certainly set that up, and it will be a part of any new member classes we do...oh, and of course confirmation.

Some questions you may have, and some brief answers...

Who is this for?

- Children who have expressed a desire to participate in Holy Communion.
- Children who have been receiving communion and want to deepen their understanding and connection to the sacrament.

What age is appropriate?

• We have guidelines in our church bylaws that say it should be offered at age 8, we're kind of catching up on that. The Roman Catholic Church sets the age of reason at around second grade, really it's up to the child and the parent or responsible grownup.

When will the workshop be offered?

• I have blocked off a couple of Sundays in October following 10:30 worship...yes I did so in consultation with the Eagles schedule. We'll need to do the schedule dance and discern what works for families. Once we have participation figured out we'll make sure to let everyone know when children will be officially welcomed and celebrated...I believe there should be cake.

How should we let you know we're interested?

Any of the usual communication channels. As always, if you come up and tell me, make sure I write it down.


