The Joyful Noise Newsletter October 2025

This is the second article looking at communion, how we use this sacrament to engage with our faith. Last month I looked at early communion, next month will be about the relationship between communion and membership in a community of faith.

I love origin stories. There are some good ones out there, your family traditions probably got started for a really good reason. "Pizza for Thanksgiving? Oh, there was that time..." Sometimes it was necessity, sometimes a superstition arose, but there is usually a good story behind what counts as normal for us.

Church is no exception, in fact some of our beautiful religious traditions have simple beginnings and the spiritual meaning made itself known in the aftermath. If you've received communion at a Lutheran church and were moved by the symbology of reaching across that low fence as if reaching into the holy place of the temple...A rural church in Germany had a problem with goats getting into the sanctuary and eating the elements, so they put up a fence...people found deep meaning and beauty in the act.

One of the traditions we Moravians celebrate is the pastor, or in some cases church elders, coming out to the congregation with the elements of communion. It's meaningful, a representative of Christ meeting you where you are, grace extended without your needing to make a move even to the end of the pew. No less meaningful when you learn it was instituted at a mid 1700s communion in Berthelsdorf Germany, in part because the young single women were disturbed in their worship by the young men clomping up the aisle in their heavy gardening shoes. What, we're just walking here...well you're a bunch of clods and we don't have to put up with this... "That's it," muttered the pastor, "everyone stay in your seats, I'm coming to you!" Ok, I admit a bit of license on the dialogue, but the gathered said you know, that was kind of beautiful. It also distinguished us from other communion practices, and we've kept it as a tradition ever since.

One practical reality with my ministry, people aren't generally comfortable with a person who is blind passing through the pews with a tray full of juice cups. Don't fret, I'm good with it, but it means we miss out on my handing you the elements.

Fortunately you've noted the term *tradition*, our practices aren't doctrinal mandates, we can do things that have a different, but equally significant meaning. At the October 5 communion service...in celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday...we'll have recipients who are able come forward to receive the elements from me. Different, yet meaningful symbolism. Worry not, of course we'll accommodate those who aren't able to leave their seat, it's not just a tradition that by grace we deepen our relationship with Christ through the sacrament of communion, it is a vital part of our life of faith. In addition to the practicalities, I invite you to open your heart to what the practice of communion means to you, deepening and expanding your relationship with God through the sacrament.



I love spending time on the mountaintop, because it is there that God gives me His blessed assurance as well as strength and courage to live in the valley. It is in the mountains that I come face-to-face with myself. It is in the mountains where I find illusive peace.

I sincerely desire that all my Schoeneck brothers and sisters find their mountaintop experience, no matter the form or the place.
