## Invitation, not condemnation...

I'd like you to hold on to that phrase, as whenever someone starts talking about rules and regulations and bylaws our brains usually snap to: am I breaking the rules? Am I in trouble or a disappointment? And of course...can I get out of the rules, maybe on a technicality?

Over the past couple of newsletter articles I've been pondering communion, and I'm thinking of the sacrament now in terms of membership...it is one of the core components of maintaining membership (along with attendance at worship and financial contribution as you are able), but if we're talking about invitation, relationships, and an open table, what is the connection between communion and membership?

First thing to look at is that idea of an open table. You'll have heard me use that term as we begin the communion service. In the Moravian Church we don't restrict the sacrament to our own members, and within our church family we don't restrict it to those who are old enough or have passed a test or made profession. We believe that the very act of desiring the sacrament declares your readiness. As I've noted in previous articles, we do offer classes and experiences designed to deepen our relationship with God through learning what the sacrament is all about, but you are welcome at Christ's table regardless. So if membership isn't required for communion, why would communion be required for membership? Remember... invitation not condemnation. The sacrament is a gift from God given by Jesus to his disciples, and onward to us to maintain our connection to God. Membership in a church is how we maintain, deepen, and reinforce that connection, and the church has a responsibility to strengthen and support that connection.

So that's why we use the communion cards to keep track of who has received the sacrament, not to get you in trouble or let you know how you're not measuring up, but to support your connection to God. If you haven't been in worship for the sacrament, or had me visit for a home communion this year, the invitation is open. The next communion service will be on November 9, and then the afternoon service on the first Sunday in Advent, November 30.




We encourage our church family to come and join those who need an extra smile or encouraging word on this special night.

## Grief Ministry in Action

For nearly six years the phrase *grief ministry* has buzzed around Schoeneck. Many have heard the words, but not everyone knows what it's all about.



In 2019, recognizing a need to better support people in our congregation through the throes of grief, Rev. Evelyn Stupp, a former hospice pastor and grief counselor offered to work with Schoeneck in developing ways to help people navigate grief.

Over the course of three years, Pastor Evelyn offered workshops to help our congregation understand the grief process so that we could more intentionally support our church family during times of loss. Pastor Evelyn also initiated a grief support group for members who were grieving the loss of loved ones. During that time, "blue" and now "quiet" Christmas services were begun at Schoeneck to honor absent loved ones and to help grieving individuals through a season of conflicting holiday emotions.

Ann-Louise Taylor is the facilitator of the grief support group. Along with Laura Cook, Debbie Getz, Loraine Rice, and Mim Stoudt, these five women have shaped Schoeneck's Grief Ministry with compassion and caring. They support individuals and families through periods of loss, assuring them that their church family is present with them through these difficult times.

The Grief Ministry provides a variety of resources: books, pamphlets, comforting scripture passages, and a Zoom support group that meets the 2nd Tuesday evening of each month. This ministry also keeps in touch with church members throughout their first year of a loss.
