
Christmas Cantata 2025 Morning Star Rises

Safe Harbor

After many, many years as coordinator of providing meals to Safe Harbor in Easton, Carolyn Hertzog, a true and humble servant, has chosen to step down starting January 2026. Carolyn has been responsible for directing members of Schoeneck to provide a dinner meal on the first Saturday of each month. Schoeneck now needs someone to take over this important role in this mission and evangelism directive for our church.

Many of our groups reserve the first Saturday of a specific month and tend to reserve the same month year after year so the role of the coordinator is to identify others to provide a dinner meal. Schoeneck is already scheduled to provide a dinner meal for all of 2026 but need to identify the person/group providing the meal.

The duties of this role are quite easy:

- Using Safe Harbor's online scheduling program, search for an open first Saturday of each month. The coordinator can also call Safe Harbor and speak to the day manager to determine the available date/time.
- Reach out to congregation member(s) or group(s) for their ability to provide a dinner meal on an open first Saturday of each month.
- Scheduling of the congregation member or group can be done online by the member/group or the coordinator. It is recommended the person/group providing the meal call the week before to find out the estimated number of residents expected for dinner.

In addition, Carolyn has offered to assist the new coordinator so he/she/group can begin to learn this rewarding role. If you are interested in this position, please contact Jim Makovetz, Board of Elders vice-chair. If you have any questions about the role, please contact Carolyn Hertzog.

Safe Harbor is a program-driven transitional shelter for homeless, single individuals as well a drop-in program for low-income adults, especially those who have difficulty with the tasks of daily life.


