

2025 WORDS OF THE YEAR

Every year the editors of various dictionaries select a word or phrase of the year. It signifies a cultural marker, sometimes for popularity, or because it describes or labels something we recognize.

For 2025, some of the Words of the year are...

- ~Oxford English Dictionary: rage bait, online content deliberately designed to provoke anger and drive engagement.
- ~Cambridge dictionary: parasocial, the one-sided relationship between a fan and a media personality, like how I think I know the presenters of my favorite YouTube channels and podcasts.
- ~Collins dictionary: vibe coding, apparently that has something to do with AI and computer coding using natural language.
- ~dictionary.com: 6-7, no, nobody knows what it means. Best I've heard is it means absolutely nothing, but it's really really popular and kind of fun.

Some of these words and phrases will stick around, some will just identify a moment, others will be taken and twisted and used as a divisive wedge, perhaps through intentional misunderstanding or misdirection...like how *theory* is applied in one way for science and is used completely differently in casual conversation, but folks use the meanings interchangeably.

Actually, that's a good illustration, some of these words of the year will be given qualifiers, the most common being just...you're just rage baiting, that's just a parasocial relationship, that's just a theory. Scientists, including those in the social sciences realm, can work diligently on refining a theory, Show "locked-in" results demonstrating the relationship between facts and outcomes, and still have folks say: well that's just a theory.

Time will tell on the 2025 selections. I'd love it if rage bait wasn't a thing, meaning we wouldn't need a term for it. I'm aware of the need to limit the number of parasocial relationships in my life...although certain podcasters still feel like friends. Six-seven? I love needing to have no clue about something the kids are saying, it's refreshing to know that everyone is just as clueless as me.

I wonder if we can identify a word of the year for Schoeneck? There are the perpetual *should*, and *who*, we say those about and around church a fair bit...you know we really *should*...somebody *should*...great idea, *who* can do that, *who should* do that? Seems a bit of a downer though, maybe our Advent themes: Hope...Peace...Joy...Love. If you had to pick one of those, which would you say best identifies or exemplifies Schoeneck this year? I'm going with joy, no wait hope, ok all of them fit. I know it won't be rage bait, and our relationships definitely aren't parasocial... maybe I'll just go with six-seven for the church too.


TRUSTEES are the stewards of the church's building and grounds, determining how our money and property can be most effectively used in order to further God's mission for the church. (3-year term)

Special Envelopes:



The special envelope for January and February is for **Foundation Repairs**. The discovery late in 2025 of powder post beetles infesting the paneling going up the stairs to the sanctuary (by the old restrooms) led to the realization that there was a moisture problem in that area as well. A historic masonry specialist was scheduled to repair some cracks in the stone foundation in January, but his schedule changed and he was able to do the repairs in November. Proceeds from this envelope will reimburse the congregation's Deferred Maintenance Fund for that expense.



The envelope for **Snow Plowing** will help pay for salting, sanding, and plowing the parking lot in inclement weather.




